Ann Carlson is a choreographic artist best known for expanding the context of choreography, performance and our perceptions. Her blend of movement, vocals, sound and visual elements have brought a strong new voice to the dance and performance world. Ms. Carlson creates works in a unique series format. The first series, **REAL PEOPLE**, began in 1985. **REAL PEOPLE's** first work, "Sloss, Kerr, Rosenberg & Morre" was created with four lawyers. Other **REAL PEOPLE** works include security officers, basket-ball players, a mother & daughter, fly-fishers & fiddlers, and corporate executives. Carlson was awarded a 1988 New York Dance/Performance Award for her second series, **ANIMALS**. Recently, Ann staged **HYDROGEN JUKEBOX**, a new opera by composer Philip Glass with libretto by Allen Ginsberg. **HYDROGEN JUKEBOX** will open at BAM this Spring. Ann is also currently working on a new series of performance and dance works entitled **WHITE**. **WHITE** explores the impact of American popular culture on experiences of love.

Ice Theatre of New York, Moira North and Rob McBrien, Directors, is the first non-competitive dance company on ice, featuring an ensemble of 10 professional skaters plus special guest artists. **Ice Theatre** provides an environment where professional skaters from various backgrounds can collaborate with choreographers, musicians, writers, and visual artists to create and perform new works. **Ice Theatre** was recently recognized by the National Endowment for the Arts with the first and only federal grant to be awarded to an ice dance company. **For more information about Ice Theatre of New York, call (212) 349-6232.**
