Founded in 1984 by Moira North, Ice Theatre of New York (ITNY) has changed the face of figure skating by creating works that integrate the sensibilities of contemporary dance, music and art. Through its performances in both traditional and alternative venues, ITNY presents on-ice dances that challenge the perceptions and conventional definitions of skating.

ITNY was the first ice dance company to receive dance program funding from the National Endowment for the Arts, the New York State Council on the Arts and the New York City Department of Cultural Affairs. In addition to building and performing works of artistic merit, ITNY also reaches out to the next generation of skaters and audiences through its exemplary education, community outreach and training programs.

ITNY's vision is to bridge the divide between the dance and skating worlds and the organization has done so by commissioning works from renowned dance choreographers including Twyla Tharp, Lar Lubovitch, Peter Martins, Susan Marshall, Ann Carlson and David Parsons; as well as works by noted ice choreographers such as Douglas Webster, Katherine Healy and David Liu.

Ice Theatre has performed in skating venues around the world and on proscenium stages such as Eisenhower Hall at West Point, Staller Center at Stony Brook University, and Zoellner Center at Lehigh University. Major dance presenters around the world have also shown ITNY's work, including Boston's Dance Umbrella, Vermont's Flynn Theatre, Dancing in the Streets and Creative Time.

As ITNY approaches its 25th Anniversary Season in the 2010/2011 season, we celebrate a quarter decade of innovative performances and enriching outreach programs. Over the years, Ice Theatre has presented a host of free public performances at The Rink at Rockefeller Plaza, The Pond at Bryant Park, and at The World Ice Arena in Queens. We have had the opportunity to perform internationally as well, most recently in France. And we have expanded our outreach program, the New Works and Young Artist Series, to serve children in Queens, in addition to the original series at Riverbank State Park in Manhattan. This program provides free performances and skating instruction to more than 3,000 public school students each year.

ABOUT THE ARTISTS

ALIZAH ALLEN (Performer), formerly an apprentice member of Ice Theatre of New York, competed in the '96 & '97 U.S. National Ladies Championships. After a long hiatus from the ice, she is proud to perform with Ice Theatre again. She will be receiving her Ed.M in Psychological Counseling from Teachers College, Columbia University this May. She especially wants to thank her husband, without his love and support she would not be skating and graduating simultaneously!

ELISA ANGELI (Performer) was born in Milan on December 25, 1979. After a successful career as a competitive ice dancer, she skated shows choreographed by Barbara Fusarpoli and others in Italy and Europe. Elisa began performing with Ice Theatre of New York in its 2005 season and accompanied Ice Theatre on tour in France in 2008 and 2009. She has been a valued company member through all of our seasons since 2005, both as a performer and a teacher. Aside from skating, Elisa is dancing for the Italian dance company, Magma Dance Company, a combination of African and contemporary dance; and has been studying aerial at the Trapeze School of New York. She is currently interested in combining skating with aerial and starred both as a skater and as an aerialist in "Cocktail on Ice" in Italy earlier this year.

ARETHA AOKI (Production Associate) is originally from Vancouver, BC and moved to NYC in 2008 after graduating from Smith College (MFA). This is her second year working with Ice Theatre and she is delighted to be on this incredible journey. Aretha is a dancer and choreographer and is showing her latest work at the Chen Dance Center this May 6-8 as part of the Newsteps Series. ALI BLANK (Performer) started her 26-year ice skating career in her hometown of Nashville, Tennessee. As a competitor, Ali is an internationally ranked skater in both singles and pairs, and is a triple USFS gold medalist. She turned professional at age 18 and travelled the world skating with Disney On Ice. In 2006, Ali starred in the Radio City Rockettes show in New York City as a pair skater. Ali has been coaching at Chelsea Piers for the past 8 years and also coaches at Figure Skating in Harlem, where she was awarded "Coach of the Year" in 2009. She graduated from the Fashion Institute of Technology in 2005, majoring in Fashion Merchandising Management. Ali launched her own custom-designed, screen-printed line of apparel, www.ablankexpression.com, in 2006, and her line is being sold in boutiques around New York City. Ali is thrilled to be performing again with Ice Theatre of New York.

JACQULYN BUGLISI (Choreographer) (Artistic Director, Buglisi Dance Theatre) has, in her four decade-long career as a choreographer, artistic director, dancer and master teacher, made an indelible impact on the field of contemporary dance. Renowned for highly visual, imagistic dances that use literature, history, and heroic archetypes as a primary source, Buglisi's ballets are sweeping, passionate, and rooted in a dramatic, visceral technique. Her repertoire of more than 60 works are archived at the New York Public Library and have been commissioned worldwide with the following companies: Ice Theatre of New York; Flamenco Festival, Madrid; Shankar Performing Arts Company, India; Shanghai Dance Ensemble, China; North Carolina Dance Theater; Richmond Ballet; The Juilliard School; and the Martha Graham Dance Company, where she was a principal dancer for 12 years. Buglisi is Chair of the Modern Department at The Ailey School. Her honors include the American Dance Guild Award, National Endowment for the Arts, and Altria's Women Choreographer Initiative Award. EVE CHALOM (Performer) competed in ice dancing for many years on an international level, winning several medals at the United States National Championships. This is especially impressive considering that she wears two hearing aids. Upon retiring from skating, she received degrees in English and Philosophy from the University of Michigan, and then moved to New York to pursue modern dance. She is currently pursuing a master's degree in Dance Therapy at Pratt Institute, in addition to teaching skating and squeezing in dance/skating when she can. She is happy to be performing with Ice Theatre again.

ANGELA CHIANG (Performer) is a USFS double gold medalist who, following her competitive career, began training and performing as an apprentice with Ice Theatre of New York during the Company's 2002 Summer Residency in Jamestown. Angela is a 2007 New York University graduate, with a BA in Journalism and Metropolitan Studies. She skated for the New York Rangers (National Hockey League) as a Rangers City Skater and appeared in an episode of Nick at Nite's "Road Crew." Angela was thrilled to skate for Ice Theatre at this year's Jimmy Fund event "An Evening With Champions" at Harvard University. As an instructor, Angela has had the pleasure of teaching the girls of Figure Skating in Harlem, and is now regularly teaching figure skating at Chelsea Piers.

ALBERTO DEL SAZ (Choreographer) is the Artistic Director of the Murray Louis and Nikolais Dance Company, as well as Co-Director of The Nikolais/Louis Foundation for Dance, and Assistant to Mr. Louis. Mr. Del Saz was born in Bilbao, Spain and, at an early age began studying ice-skating, which later led to his first performing career. In 1980 Mr. del Saz became the Spanish National Champion and soon made his debut with Holiday on Ice-International. In 1985 Mr. Del Saz made his debut as a lead soloist with the Nikolais Dance Theater, later renamed the Murray Louis and Nikolais Dance Company. As a member of this internationally acclaimed company he has toured to virtually every continent on the globe. Mr. Del Saz is the Reconstruction

MICHAEL DIONYSIOU (Performer) is a USFS double gold medalist. A native of New York - though he trained and lived in Tampa Bay, Florida - Michael has performed in several productions, including Advanced Entertainment Group; "World Rhythms on Ice" 2000-2004, Disney on Ice International Tour "Mickey's & Minnie's Magical Journey" 2004, and Holiday on Ice International Tours "Diamonds" and "Mystery" 2004-2010. As a cast member of "Mystery," Michael had the pleasure to work with noted choreographer and Olympic Champion Robin Cousins. He was invited to participate as a soloist in "The International Skating Academy" by Holiday on Ice in The Netherlands in 2009. He also took part in the "2006 Dutch Olympic Team Ceremony Show" by Holiday on Ice. Currently, Michael is an instructor at Sky Rink Chelsea Piers and is enthused to be a part of Ice Theatre of New York.

KRISTINA FALCO AND ANDREW NAYLOR (Performers) are performing for the first time with Ice Theatre of New York. Andrew is a former Olympic Pairs Competitor and a National Champion from Great Britain. He has performed in skating shows across the world. Kristina is from New Jersey, and has won many competitions regionally and nationally. They are both looking forward to performing with Ice Theatre.

MICHELE FORCHIONE (Performer) was born in Ohio. She put on her first pair of skates before she was three years old. She was a Junior Ladies Freestyle skater and a Junior National competitor. Earlier this year, Michele was a part of ABC's Ugly Betty as a skating double. This is Michele's first year with Ice Theatre of New York and she is thrilled to be a part of this ensemble.



TYRRELL GENE (Performer) started dancing at the age of three in his hometown of Wenatchee, Washington. Dancing, which was initially a form of therapy for his stroke-induced paralysis, led him into figure skating. Tyrrell trained as an ice dancer and was a 5-time national competitor. He has continued his cross training with his studies and performances of jazz, ballet, modern and ballroom dancing. He has been with Ice Theatre of New York since 2001 and performed with the company in the 2008 and 2009 French tours. A valued performer both in our arena and stage performances, Tyrrell is also a respected teacher by company members and skating students alike.

LINE HADDAD (Performer) is a World and Olympic pair skater and was the youngest athlete to compete at the Olympics in 1992 at Albertville. She is a two-time French National Champion, and a one-time Israeli National Champion. As a dancer, she graduated from the Paris Conservatoire in ballet and most recently

performed with the modern dance company, Isabel Gotzkowsky And Friends. After touring with Philippe Candeloro and the French team, Line joined the Ice Theatre of New York in 2003 and was featured in Dance Visions on Ice on NBC. Line is currently working as a consultant and choreographer for the French Ice-skating Federation. She also received her Master of Arts in translation and linguistics in Paris, majoring in French, English, and Spanish.

MARNI HALASA (Performer), a USFS double gold medalist and staff professional at Chelsea Piers, has skated with Ice Theatre of New York for special events. Taking what she has learned from performing, Marni currently debuts her iconic rollerblading personality in parades and events all across New York City, as noted by the New York Daily News, New York Post, New York Times and National Enquirer. Other credits include a featured belly dancer for the sequel to the movie, "Sex in the City;" choreographing rollerblading dance scenes for the Disney movie, "Enchanted;" and performing on MTV and the Today Show, where Marni belly danced on rollerblades and taught Al Roker how to shimmy.

ELIZABETH L'HEUREUX (Performer) is a USFS and ISU gold medalist in figures and freestyle. She was Senior Ladies North Atlantic Regional Champion and has performed professionally in ice shows in Atami, Japan; Nott's Berry farm, California; and Bally's Grand, Atlantic City. Elizabeth has been teaching at Wollman Rink in Central Park for 10 years. Prior to becoming a figure skating coach, Elizabeth earned a law degree and is licensed to practice in New York and New Jersey. She is married to Jose Reis and they have a 7-year old son, Gabriel. LAR LUBOVITCH (Choreographer) is one of America's most versatile, popular, and highly acclaimed choreographers. He founded the Lar Lubovitch Dance Company 41 years ago and has created more than 100 dances for the company. Based in New York City, the company has performed throughout the world. The company's most recent home seasons have featured an outpouring of new work, including the premieres of Men's Stories, The Wedding, My Funny Valentine, Smile With My Heart, Pentimento, Elemental Brubeck, Love Stories, Little Rhapsodies and Dvořák Serenade. The company's dances are much in demand and have also been performed by many other major companies, including American Ballet Theatre, New York City Ballet, and Alvin Ailey. His dance Artemis, based on a Greek myth, was commissioned by the Cultural Olympics, and premiered at the Metropolitan Opera House. His three-act ballet Othello (an unprecedented 3-way collaboration among the Lubovitch company, American Ballet Theater, and the San Francisco Ballet) also premiered at the Met to great acclaim in 1997. Othello was subsequently broadcast throughout the United States on PBS's "Great Performances," and was nominated for an Emmy Award. The company's dance for film also includes Fandango (winner of an International Emmy Award) and My Funny Valentine for the Robert Altman film "The Company" (for which Lubovitch was nominated for an American Choreography Award). Mr. Lubovitch has also made a notable contribution to choreography in the field of ice-dancing, having created many dances for Olympic skaters John Curry, Dorothy Hamill, Peggy Fleming, Brian Orser, Jo-Jo Starbuck and Paul Wylie; as well as two one-hour ice-dances for television: The Sleeping Beauty (PBS) and The Planets (A&E) (which was nominated for an International Emmy Award, a Cable Ace Award, and a Grammy Award). His award-winning work on Broadway includes Into the Woods (Tony Award nomination), The Red Shoes (Astaire Award), and the Tony Award-winning revival of The King and I. ing "Appalachia Waltz," co-choreographed with Doug Webster. Shaw is the recipient of two NEA Choreographic Fellowships. Ms. Shaw teaches on the faculty at Juilliard and The Ailey School/Fordham.

KENNY MOIR (Performer) began skating in his native North Vancouver, Canada over 48 years ago. His 18-year competitive career included 8 Canadian Championship appearances, a Canadian Championship Silver Medal, and induction into the British Columbia Sports Hall of Fame as a Sports Merit award winner. Since founding Ice Theatre of New York in 1984, she has commissioned renowned dance choreographers to make new works for the comwhile nurturing and developing choreographers from the world of ice. She has also been a catalyst in the development of other artistic ice dance companies in both Canada and the United States. 


