



ABOUT THE COMPANY

Ice Theatre of New York recently celebrated its 21st anniversary. Founded in 1984 by Moira North, Ice Theatre remains dedicated to developing figure skating as a performing art through its performances and educational programs. The company continues to inspire a unique environment in which professional skaters from various backgrounds collaborate with dance and ice choreographers, musicians, writers and visual artists to create and perform new works. Ice Theatre is the nation's first not-for-profit ice dancing ensemble to be awarded grants as a dance company by the National Endowment for the Arts, New York State Council on the Arts and the New York City Department of Cultural Affairs.

Over the past two decades, the company has created a repertory of more than 60 works, including works by major modern dance choreographers such as Jacqulyn Buglisi, Ann Carlson, Laura Dean, Alberto Del Saz, Donlin Foreman, David Dorfman, Lar Lubovitch, Elisa Monte, David Parsons, JoAnna Mendl Shaw, Heather Harrington and Carlos Orta, as well as works by renowned ice choreographers Douglas Webster and David Liu. The repertory ranges from 12-skater ensemble dances to solos, duets and trios, with music from classical to contemporary. Among the illustrious guest artists who have performed with Ice Theatre are Olympic champion John Curry, Toller Cranston, Paul Wylie, Yuka Sato, Gary Beacom, Oksana Baiul and Katherine Healy.

Ice Theatre has participated in several distinctive projects such as the *Montreal Fashions on Ice*, an annual show at Rockefeller Center, featuring unique styles from Montreal; *Winter Solstice on Ice*, a TV production shot in Finland and aired by A&E; and performing recently for the opening of the film *The Polar Express*. Major dance presenters, including Boston's Dance Umbrella, Vermont's Flynn Theatre, Dancing in the Streets and Creative Time, as well as European hosts, have produced Ice Theatre. In addition to traditional rink settings, the company performs on proscenium stages and plastic ice as well.

Outreach programs include a Lunchtime Concert Series at the rink at Rockefeller Plaza, free to the public. The New Works and Young Artists Series at Riverbank State Park is dedicated to giving emerging choreographers and young performers the opportunity to present new works to audiences of school children from the area and to providing skating clinics for public school

students from Harlem and Washington Heights. The company has also performed and conducted master classes throughout the United States and Canada, and presently is offering classes at Sky Rink in New York City.

Ice Theatre of New York stages much more than merely an ice show. In December 2002, Margo Jefferson of *The New York Times* rated Ice Theatre of New York in the Top Ten Theatre tickets for the year. In 2004, the company received a grant from the New York State Council on the Arts to commission renowned New York dance choreographer David Parsons to create his first work for ice, "Twist," which Francis Mason of *The New York Times* Radio WQXR appropriately called, "a fiercely complicated duet." Mason has also called principal skater David Liu "Nijinsky on ice." Also in 2004, renowned ice choreographer Douglas Webster returned to New York to act as associate artistic director of the company. Webster, with his vast experience in the worlds of figure skating, entertainment and artistry, brings a wealth of passion, expertise, exuberance and energy to the company.
